Acknowledgement, Acceptance and Deed of Re-conveyance

Summary:

This document serves as an official record where the undersigned, Mary Jane Doe, acknowledges, accepts, and reconveys her lawful Trade Name along with all derivative names and variations to the land and soil of the unincorporated South African Republic. It further nullifies any previous legal or assumed powers of attorney, executorships, guardianships, or agency relationships, establishing the signatory as the sole authority over her name and estate.

Key Sections

Declarant's Statement

Re-Conveyance of Trade Name: The declarant, Mary Jane Doe, acknowledges and re-conveys her lawful Trade

Name and all derivative names, such as Mary Doe, Mary Jane Doe, Mary J. Doe, M.J. Doe, and other variations, back to the unincorporated South African Republic.

Identity Number: Space is provided to insert the CUSIP number associated with these names.

Permanent Domicile: The document affirms that all names and variations will have their permanent domicile on the land and soil of the unincorporated District/State.

Termination of Prior Relationships

Revocation of Powers: All previous Powers of Attorney, executorships, guardianships, and agency relationships are revoked, effective from the declarant's natural birthday on July 11, 1967. The declarant elects to be recognized as the sole living donor, beneficiary, and agent of her name and estate from her 21st birthday on July 11, 1988.

Biological Offspring Clause

Offspring Clause: The declarant asserts the same re-conveyance applies to her biological offspring, listing their

full names and identity numbers. This clause establishes that the children are considered the private property of the declarant until they reach the age of majority. This paragraph can be

deleted if the declarant does not have children.

Execution and Affirmation

Date and Signature: The declarant is required to sign the document, including a red-ink or food coloring thumbprint.

The signature affirms that the document was signed freely and without duress.

Non-Negotiable Autograph: The document is signed as "mary jane doe for MARY JANE DOE," with all rights reserved, making the autograph non-negotiable.

Witness Section

Witness Acknowledgment: If no public notary is available, the document can be witnessed by two living witnesses.

The witnesses affirm that they saw the declarant sign and seal the document in their presence, print their names, and provide contact information.
